When Jean was taking the afternoon watercolor class at OLLI (CLE at that time) she overheard



classmates stating how they wished they knew how to draw. Aspects of perspective and proportions eluded them. Jean was an art major; she could fill the need. She volunteered to teach the drawing class.

Jean was born in Rhinelander, Wisconsin, and

graduated with a B.A. in Fine Art from Mundelein University in Chicago, housed in a skyscraper at the end of Outer Drive. She came to California in 1965, and met Carmine at the Catholic Alumni Club across the street from Disneyland in 1969. They married in 1970. Later she and Carmine attended the United States International University in England where they both finished their Masters degrees.

For a while Jean taught art at Torrance High School. One summer she took on a summer job teaching art to the Junior Blind. She so enjoyed this experience that she returned to school to complete a credential in Special Education. She took time out to raise four children. After they were all in school she returned to the classroom, teaching at South Junior High School in Anaheim. She taught in public schools for a total of 24 years.

The Casucci's have belonged to OLLI for the past 14 years. She taught calligraphy for a few semesters prior to taking on the "Drawing for the Fun of It" class, which she has taught ever since, invited members to "have fun working with the right side of your brain"—and indeed they did.

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Renew Your Membership Now

Membership renewal for the 2016-2017 OLLI school year or fall 2016 semester is now online. Paper registration is no longer accepted. For those needing assistance with the new online process, help is available.

- If you have not created your OLLI student account giving you access to CSUF WiFi, then please come to the OLLI office between 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. to obtain your campus-wide identification number (CWID) and PIN numbers. The office will give you a form listing your CWID and PIN and information about how to create a student account with a username and password on the Student Portal.
- You must have your student account username and password to renew online. If you already have access to the CSUF WiFi, then you have established your OLLI student account.
- You can renew your OLLI membership online from your home computer by going to the OLLI website at https://olli.fullerton.edu/olliregister. The registration system will first ask you to log into the CSUF Student Portal, which will ask for your student username and password. If you don't have those, the system will take you to the Student Portal to establish your OLLI student account.

- Once you are logged in with your username and password, the registration system brings up the membership renewal form with your name, CWID number and CSUF email address pre-entered. It is important that you add your personal email address. For assistance or questions about using the online registration system contact Brandy Schaal at 657-278-7269 or bschaal@fullerton.edu.
- If you don't have a computer at home, or if you need help with the process, you can come to OLLI's computer lab in Room 20, open Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Volunteers will be there who are dedicated to helping members renew their registration online on the spot. Note, the University is closed on September 5.

is constantly on the look-out for how she can help others. She began collecting books for children when she volunteered at the St. Vincent de Paul food pantry at St. Anthony parish in Anaheim. She collected used books from thrift shops, libraries, school storage rooms and from OLLI members who donated books once used by their grandchildren.

Boxes of books were often piled high in her front room and dining room, where she repaired torn pages and removed library pockets before taking them into the Boy Scout shed where food was distributed for the needy. As the parents collected groceries for the week, the children visited another table where Jean handed out books to the children, assisting them in selecting books for their appropriate reading levels. These books were for the children to keep, to build mini libraries in homes where few, if any, books were available. Today her example is being replicated at St. Juliana's, a Catholic school in Fullerton.

Although Jean will no longer be teaching the drawing class, she and her faithful class coordinator/husband, Carmine Casucci, will still be active members of OLLI. Jean is looking forward to attending the "Short Stories" class, the "Mystery Book Club" class and renewing her recorder skills in the OLLI recorder class. She is also thinking of doing some three-dimensional art, perhaps sculpture, silver casting or stained glass work. Just so she won't get bored she is already planning to begin work as a volunteer teacher with handicapped adults, sharing with them her skills in the many facets of art.

served in the United States Air Force from 1955 until 1958, has assumed the position of Staff Writer for the ChroniCLE.

He attended Santa

Monica College until he was hired by the System Development Corporation in Santa Monica. The company is responsible for automating the United States and Canadian Air Defense Systems. He began in Quality Control, then managed a section of 19 employees who put together the documentation for this training. He designed these exercises which required writing, conducting design reviews and utilizing 80 programs. He was in charge of collecting data from 167 schools in the nation related to federal aid to education.

In 1979 Denny was hired by Hughes Aircraft in Fullerton in the Command and Control Division as a Systems Engineer. When Hughes was purchased

by GM, Denny was the sixth person sent to Detroit to teach automotive engineers how to perform aerospace systems engineering.

Denny, who retired in 1994, said the first 20 years of his retirement were the best years of his life. During this time he was engaged in numerous physical activities including mountain climbing, cross country and downhill skiing, kayaking, fishing and hunting. He was a member of the Friends of Coyote Hills, Friends of Harbors, Beaches and Parks, the County Regional and Recreational Trails Committee, Sierra Club and was on the Orange County Grand Jury in 2004 and 2005. Denny recently joined the Neighbors United for Fullerton.

Denny and his wife love to travel and recently returned from an Alaskan cruise. They also cruised from St. Petersburg to Moscow on the Danube and Rhine rivers. They traveled by train through the Canadian Rockies, took land trips in Europe and traveled by car through Tuscany.

Early in his career with Hughes he lived and worked in London. Denny said he was fortunate that his family could be with him. During this time they toured Wales, Scotland and seven countries in Europe. He said they had to show their passports and change currency at each border. At the present time Denny is writing his life story and "doing genealogy where two branches of his family go back to the 13th century."

His activities at OLLI include attending movies on Mondays and Fridays. He also plays poker at the end of the week, and proudly said he came in second place at one of the tournaments. Denny purchased a Mac Book Pro and takes lessons from Gary Bates and Bob Newcomb. He praises our music venues as wonderful, as are all the other classes he has attended.
