


OSHER LIFELONG LEARNING INSTITUTE (OLLI)

CHARTER

Residing in Orange County are many retired and semi-retired persons who are very knowledgeable and broadly experienced in many intellectual and professional fields and who appreciate and value learning. These persons have a strong desire to continue their intellectual pursuits in the university environment. They also constitute a substantial reservoir of knowledge and experience that should be maintained and enhanced through continuing study, both for the well-being of the individuals involved as well as for the contributions they can make to the university and the community at large.

To organize this group and to meet their special needs, California State University, Fullerton authorizes by this Charter the establishment of the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute, which will be an integral part of the University community, functioning under the direction and supervision of the University Extended Education. As a program within the University, its members can learn and teach in self-directed study groups and participate in the academic programs of the University.

The organization, operation, support, membership requirements, privileges, fees and facilities provided by the University will be in accordance with the Constitution and By-laws of the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute as approved by its membership and the president of California State University, Fullerton, or his designated representatives.
