# Vice President External Relations Bob Kovacev

Bob was born in New York City and grew up in Los Angeles. He graduated from Cal State LA with degrees in engineering and physics and an M.B.A. He earned a doctorate in business administration with an emphasis in

entrepreneurship from the University of Phoenix School of Advanced Studies.

Bob has had several careers—technologist, international executive and educator. He was recruited in his senior year of college to work as a physicist in the early days of the Apollo Program, responsible for designing the radiation shielding that protected the astronauts during launch and re-entry. Later in his career he was in senior management on the Star Wars National Missile defense program.

As an international marketing and program management executive in the electronics, computer

and law enforcement technology industries, Bob travelled extensively throughout the Middle East, Europe, East and Southeast Asia, and Australia. At one point, he was Director of Canadian Operations, for Printrak International, working with the RCMP and local Canadian police agencies to develop the Canadian national fingerprint identification and criminal history systems.

Dr. Kovacev was an educator for over 20 years teaching marketing, finance and entrepreneurship at Cal State Fullerton. During that time, he mentored fledgling companies in the CSUF Start-up Incubator, and started the Finance Department's first internship program. He is currently on the Board of Directors of a successful firm started by one of his students.

In 2022, Bob was elected OLLI's Vice President External Relations for the 2022-24 term. One of his primary responsibilities is to strengthen OLLI's relationship with the University by reaching out to the CSUF community to ensure that administrators, faculty and staff know about our programs and by meeting with the deans from the various colleges on campus.

A major responsibility is to communicate and coordinate OLLI's outreach programs, both to the Cal State Fullerton community and to the greater off-campus community at large, to familiarize them with OLLI and its mission and recruit new members for OLLI. Bob has re-energized the speakers' bureau and has made OLLI presentations during appearances of OLLI performing groups and conducted speaking engagements at retirement fairs, organizations and communities, discussing retirement issues and the benefits of OLLI membership.

Bob designs promotional strategies, brochures, advertisements and marketing brochures and coordinates media releases and advertising to promote OLLI's Fall Open House and membership in OLLI-CSUF.

He also coordinates the OLLI-CSUF Collaboration Program whose focus is to encourage OLLI members to bring their talents and expertise earned during their lifetimes of experience to CSUF students, faculty and administrators by consulting, *Vice President ...Continued on Page 3*

On the contrary, we need everyone to address our critical challenges of rebuilding our "on-campus" community for optimal intellectual and social interaction while providing the undeniable opportunities presented by virtual or hybrid instruction.

# Kirt Spradlin President 2003 - 2004 The Saga of Kirt's Bench A Memorial to Kirt Spradlin

You may have noticed a new park bench on the east side of the Ruby Gerontology Center. This is the tale of the long road to the reality of that actual bench vs. the dream of a memorial to one of OLLI's finest Legends, Kirt Spradlin.

At the time when CLE (Continuing Learning Experience) was transitioning to OLLI, not all members shared the same vision of how to build on the best of the old ways while embracing the best of the new. Kirt was one of the heroes who led the way and, as the 11th President of OLLI's Board of Trustees, helped to smooth the, sometimes, rocky road.

Kirt continued as an OLLI leader by taking on the Treasurer's job. He understood the importance of computers and technology as basic to our future, so he volunteered with the Computer Education Committee (CEC). Through the years he was a member of several committees.

Donna, Kirt's wife, was also an active OLLI volunteer especially on the Trips Committee, as the Baseball Bash Chair, and as a hard-working event planner on the Hospitality Committee. Kirt always supported her efforts and vice versa. Trips to the Jet Propulsion Lab and the Hollywood Bowl were their favorites. At the first Baseball Bash in 2004, Kirt was the catcher to Leo Shapiro's first pitch; a few years later, Kirt threw the first pitch.

At the time of Kirt's passing, the Hospitality Committee claimed him as an honorary member. He always got the best behind-the-scenes pictures. A successful OLLI future needs a strong base, so Kirt photographed all OLLI functions. A picture can be worth a thousand words, and Kirt recorded OLLI's life in pictures.

Kirt and Donna rarely missed an event and travelled with several OLLI trips including going to New Zealand, where a real Maori Chief made Kirt an honorary chief. The "chief" also helped clean up after OLLI events. Kirt Spradlin was a gentle man and a gentleman, an excellent example of an OLLI leader.

Kirt's Bench, from the first ideas to the final installation, is the product of many hours of dedication and persistence by many, many OLLI members and staff. The project began in the days after Kirt's passing, June 14, 2020. The kernel of something substantial that would be seen, and used, and serve as a reminder of a special OLLI leader, started in the Hospitality Committee and soon spread across OLLI.

At this same time, many members had become aware of the need for an accessible spot to wait safely for their pick-up drivers. A bench installed just outside the RGC courtyard and under a friendly small tree might be a good solution. Matching other courtyard benches, it is made of recycled plastic with a lifetime guarantee against sun damage and it needs no maintenance—all qualities Kirt would approve. Donna and her family approved the memorial to Kirt that would be engraved on the bench. The Board supported the idea; purchase orders would be written; but then ... the pandemic and campus closure put the whole project on hold!

In 2022, the campus began to come alive again; however, many departments were impacted by backlogs of delayed projects and the channels of approvals and scheduling had changed personnel and guidelines. OLLI members and staff put greater effort into finding and navigating new roads to success.

Finally, the bench was ordered, delivered and assembled (by an OLLI member) in time for a dedication by CSUF President Fram Virjee at OLLI's 2023 Spring Preview. The actual installation was completed on May 2, 2023. Donna and her family, along with many OLLI members, came together at the RGC to honor their own at the unveiling of Kirt's Bench. Have a seat.

#### **Parking Permits Going Virtual**

Starting September 1, 2023, all OLLI members will be issued virtual parking passes. Cal State Fullerton is doing away with hang tag parking permits to park on campus. Instead, each member's car will be registered with CSUF's Parking and Transportation Services, and cars parked on campus will be monitored by campus parking control officers electronically to confirm that they have permits to park.

The parking permit registration process was added to OLLI's online membership registration and renewal system for 2023-2024 academic year renewals. You will be asked for your car's make, color and license plate number on the membership renewal form. You will no longer need to hang a parking permit on your rearview mirror. Your car will be registered to park any time in any parking lot or parking structure on campus that is authorized for OLLI members (see the Parking & OLLI Trolley Information section of the Blue Book).

Here are some additional details:

• Only one vehicle may be initially registered for each member. Members may call Parking and Transportation for a single day "omit exceptions" up to two times a month if they drive a vehicle other than their registered vehicle. [A special procedure is required to permanently add additional vehicles to the permit database.]

• When vehicles are sold or otherwise transferred, the replacement vehicle may be added through an online form on the CSUF Parking and Transportation website.

• Online registration is effective within 48 hours upon the periodic updating of the virtual permit database.

• Visitors must purchase a single-day, virtual parking permit (currently \$10.00) through the Park Mobile app on your cellphone (credit cards only) at <u>http://parkmobile.io/</u>. Physical paper parking permits, which were previously purchased through vending kiosks, are no longer issued. Visitor permits are valid in all student parking lots and structures, but are not valid in Lot J, adjacent to the RGC, nor the student housing lot. Permits are not required Fridays after 5 p.m. nor on Saturdays and Sundays.

• Guest speakers must have a virtual, singleday pass, requested at least 72 hours before their parking date. The day permit fee of \$10 will be waived if the attended OLLI course is identified.

• Vehicles without a valid permit will be issued a parking citation requiring payment of an \$80 fine (\$160 if not paid within 21 days), unless appealed. Generally, Parking and Transportation will grant one appeal per semester if the permit holder submits a written request with good reason on their required form.

• Additional information about the process is available at <u>Automated License Plate Recognition</u> (LPR) - Parking and Transportation Services | <u>CSUF (fullerton.edu)</u>.

• OLLI Vice President Administration Bill Sampson is the "point person" in getting questions answered about the new parking permit system.

# OLLI Masters in Gerontology Award Winner: Patricia Kuresa-Boone

Every year OLLI selects one outstanding Masters in Gerontology graduate student to be recognized for his or her exceptional contributions to the field of gerontology. This year the Masters in Gerontology Outstanding Graduate Award was presented to recipient Patricia Kuresa-Boone by

Theater on May 22. The award is supported by a check from OLLI for \$1,000.

Patricia has had a varied career before becoming interested in work with aging individuals. She had previously worked with children at Olive Crest as a direct care specialist working with teens. Before attending CSUF, she pursued a business law degree at Chapman University. After taking some time off to deal with her own health issues, she knew that she no longer wanted a business law degree. She transferred to CSUF, majoring in Human Services with a concentration on mental health and preparing to go into the Master in Social Work program.

She started noticing her mother's aging processes—vision and hearing problems, as well as heart issues. As an eldest daughter, she started advocating for her mother by doing some research to better understand her mother's medical procedures.

In the graduate program, Patricia gained a deeper understanding of the aging process, including the social, biological and psychological issues that older adults experience. She gained knowledge of ethical and policy issues related to aging. The graduate program allowed her to take advantage of an in-patient hospice care unit internship with VITAS at UC Irvine, where she provided emotional support to patients and their families. During her internships she worked with patients with dementia and Alzheimer's.

Patricia advocates for the rights of older adults during end-of-life care, helping to provide information about the best possible care to patients and their families. This ensures that patients receive the necessary support and assistance to maintain a dignified end of life. Her career aspiration is to find an organization with a mission alignment with her values and beliefs in advocating for older adults in end-of-life care, and offering support and education to families and helping patients and families navigate the various healthcare systems and providing grief counseling.

Patricia is well-aware of the prevalence of ageism and how it affects older adults' opportunities and experiences in different domains. She believes that the aging sector can promote intergenerational knowledge exchange and collaboration to combat this issue. Her thesis project brought together OLLI members who shared their life journeys with college students. As an example of enlightenment about aging, she sees OLLI's Flash Mob group as an excellent way for younger people to experience what older adults can do.

Patricia plans to continue volunteering in the community and at UC Irvine's hospice care unit, as well as the Project LIFE program at CSUF-OLLI. She also plans to continue research that will help direct her toward future employment opportunities. She is very appreciative of receiving the Outstanding Graduate Award from OLLI.

## Blue Book Program Catalog And Schedule of Classes and Events

The newly annualized Blue Book Program Catalog and the new Schedule of Classes and Events are designed to complement each other.

In addition to the traditional information about OLLI in the front of the Blue Book Program Catalog, it will now have the descriptions for all the programs planned for the entire academic year—fall semester 2023, spring semester 2024 and summer session 2024. Each program description will indicate in which semester(s) and/or session it will be offered and how often it will meet. But the dates, times and venues for the individual classes and events for those programs are not included because they are not scheduled until just prior to each semester or session.

That's where the new Schedule of Classes and Events comes in; it is a complementary publication done in advance of each semester/session giving the dates, times, venues for the class meetings or events and, where applicable, special requirements such as pre-registration, fees or textbooks. It provides this information in a convenient listing by each day of the week and time of the day in chronological order.

The Blue Book Program Catalog and the Schedule of Classes and Events both have a table of programs up front, listed by areas of study (The Arts, Languages, Economics, Humanities & Social Sciences, Healthy Living, Science, Technology, Special Interest Groups & Social Programs, OLLI Events and Committee Meetings). The difference is that the Table of Contents in the Schedule of Classes and Events only lists those programs offered during that one semester or session, and the page number(s) listed for each program take you to the page(s) in the day-of-the-week index where that program's meeting schedule is listed. A mockup of the new Schedule of Classes and Events can be viewed by clicking on the link in the email that delivered this ChroniCLE to you.

Forums on Zoom at noon on the Mondays following each Board meeting (second Thursday of the month) open to all OLLI members to discuss important issues and solicit feedback.

• EIP Dean Leahy discussed ongoing changes in CSUF staff, including the retirement of President Virjee and change in CSUF Provost.

• Updates to the officers' appointed positions were requested by VP Communications Chris Shaw.

Following are highlights from OLLI's Board of Trustees meeting on June 8, 2023:

• Lisa Sewell was appointed Vice President Hospitality.

• President Stover's current focuses: 1. Member outreach about their OLLI experience; 2. Supporting the Hospitality Committee with their goals; 3. Planning the Open House on August 5; 4. Improving coordination between OLLI and CSUF support departments; 5. Coordinating the rollout of CSUF's new virtual parking permits; and 6. Finding a chair for the Development/Philanthropy Committee.

• Membership now totals 1,118, including 230 new members.

• The breakdown of membership fees for partialyear enrollment was announced: Full academic year = \$275; one semester (fall or spring) = \$160; summer session only = \$90; two semesters (fall & spring) = \$200.

• Brainstorming was done on increasing membership, recruiting new volunteers and bringing more members back on-campus to increase members' social interaction.

• Mackey Auditorium renovations have begun. It may not be done before the Open House.

• Extensive work is underway in preparation for the Open House.

• Campus parking permits will be virtual beginning September 1 [see details in this ChroniCLE].

• The Bring a Friend event to encourage social interaction on campus was successful and more such social events will be planned.

• Administrative Manager Patsy Burns advised that auditing of CSUF courses is not available in the summer.
