“Meet ChatGPT: Your New Conversation Partner”

- What is ChatGPT, and how does it work
 - Trying your first prompts from recipes to travel tips
 - Building confidence in asking questions
 - Hands-on: guided ChatGPT practice on your device
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Session 3 – October 16

“AI at Home, Work, and Play”

- Everyday uses: organization, reminders, research help
- Creative tools: drafting a poem, generating images, summarizing news

- Sharing stories: how classmates are already using AI
 - Hands-on: AI as your personal assistant
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Session 4 – October 30

“AI and You: Ethics, Privacy & Trust”

- How AI handles your data
 - Benefits vs. risks (privacy, misinformation, deepfakes)
 - Small group discussions: What would you trust AI to do?
 - Hands-on: privacy settings & safe AI use tips
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Session 5 – November 13

“AI and Creativity”

- Exploring music, art, and writing with AI
 - Can AI be original? Where does creativity live?
 - Group activity: make something with AI together
 - Hands-on: generating text, art, or ideas with your device
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Session 6 – December 4

“Looking Ahead: The Future of AI”

- Where AI is heading in society, healthcare, education, and beyond
- Reflecting on our personal journeys through the course
