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# Jim Monroe Vice President Technology

Jim Monroe was elected to serve on the Board of Trustees as Vice President Technology in 2022 for a two-year term, ending in May 2024. Jim's educational

background began

in Michigan. He graduated from Michigan Technological University with a degree in physics in 1969. Subsequently, he moved to California, working at North American Rockwell (now Boeing), first as an engineer and later as a program manager. While working, he attended CSUF, receiving his M.B.A. in 1984.

Jim initially joined the OLLI Board as a Trustee at Large, and from there moved on to the position of Vice President Programs. For a time, Jim also acted as the Board Parliamentarian, a non-elective but necessary position. Jim's next challenge was serving as OLLI's Treasurer. As if all those jobs and work on various committees weren't enough, in 2017 Jim was elected President of OLLI for a two-year term.

The Vice President Technology is responsible for managing the audiovisual (AV) systems in classrooms and meeting rooms, supporting the Distance Learning team and technology, and serves as the liaison to the campus technology entities.

Jim leads a team of volunteers in supporting instructors and coordinators in the use of the classroom AV resources. This support includes demonstrating how to operate the AV gear ahead of a class or troubleshooting why the presentation isn't showing on the projection screen. This is a challenging task since the operational details vary for each classroom. Instructions for using the AV equipment are also available on the OLLI website under <u>Coordinator's Information</u>. The team also helps Jim identify needs for updates and additions to the classroom AV equipment to better serve OLLI's needs.

Since the pandemic and the advent of Zoom and streaming classes, technical volunteers have become even more essential and the number of those providing technical help has grown to meet the need. Most hybrid Zoom or streaming classes are supported by technical coordinators who make the technology magic happen. OLLI is very thankful for all this support, and Jim continues to look for additional technical coordinators to help make these classes work. If you are interested in assisting with a class, please contact Jim directly.

Jim Monroe assisted Bob Newcomb in the development of OLLI's in-class Zoom and livestreaming capabilities through the installation of specialized classroom hardware. Jim and Bob have worked with OLLI's more tech-savvy members to train instructors and tech coordinators to host Zoom classes, as well as help OLLI members learn how to use the Zoom teleconferencing app and livestream through the Vimeo website. This enables all members to join and participate in OLLI's many programs offered online.

Thanks to all those members who have volunteered to help make OLLI better through technology.

The People's Houses: Lawmaking, Policy and Politics by the U.S. Congress and the California Legislature

On three Thursdays (February 2, March 2 and April 6) from 10:15 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. in Mackey

Auditorium and on Zoom, Mike will present "The People's Houses: Lawmaking, Policy and Politics by the U.S. Congress and the California Legislature."

This course spotlights the legislative process and the critical issues facing the U.S. Congress and California Legislature. These "people's houses" are similar bicameral (upper and lower house) legislative houses but couldn't be more different in their political contexts, relationships with their chief executives, public approval ratings and many procedures. With America and California at critical crossroads regarding government direction, ranging from environmental and immigration policy to education and taxation policy, this "ripped from the headlines" course provides timely information to inform, educate and entertain.

### What's Happening at the Board

Following are highlights from OLLI's Board of Trustees meetings on October 13 and November 10, 2022.

• OLLI membership is now 944. Membership registration for the spring semester will begin December 12.

• OLLI had a net operating loss for fiscal year 2021, but endowment and investment earnings were well above that.

• The Long Term Plan Committee has contracted students from CSUF's College of Business and Economics to research and propose actions to improve OLLI's recruitment of new members. Their focus is OLLI's social media and website. They are currently conducting surveys and interviews of OLLI members and obtaining photos and videos of members for publicity.

• The following members of the Nomination and Election Committee were appointed to solicit applications and nominate candidates for Board positions up for election in April 2023: Bob Kovacev (Chair), Renee Cabrera, Jim Monroe, Jim Ertle, Rayleen Williams, Joyce Ono (Past President) and Phil Barnhard (Parliamentarian).

• The spring semester Blue Book is in production with distribution to members expected the first week of December.

• Planning has begun for the January 14 Spring Preview Meeting.

• New Shapiro Wing flooring is scheduled for December during the intersession. Some classes may need to be moved or cancelled.

• Shapiro moveable wall repair is scheduled for January during the intersession.

• Funds were approved to replace 10 guest chairs in the Shapiro Wing foyer.

OLLI's VP Technology and Administrative Manager were authorized to discuss, negotiate and plan with CSUF the various upgrades needed in Mackey Auditorium. Upgrade work is now planned for summer 2023.

• Some audio-visual equipment was stolen from Mackey Auditorium.

• Purchase of a new color laser printer was authorized for the OLLI office.

• Budget planning for the 2023-24 fiscal year has begun.

• The Policies and Procedures Committee is reviewing allowing OLLI members' friends and family to attend events that are not sold out.

• OLLI policy was amended to reflect the current responsibilities of the VP Programs and Curriculum Committee.

• OLLI's governing documents (Charter, Constitution and Bylaws) were authorized to be posted on the OLLI website in addition to the existing Policies for the information of members and the public.

• Participation in the Toys for Tots drive was authorized in conjunction with the Hospitality Committee's Mingle and Jungle Holiday Luncheon this year. CSUF encourages support of these kinds of organizations. The Policies and Procedures Committee will review the need for a new or revised policy. Receptacles are in the Ruby Gerontology Center for donating toys prior to the luncheon.
