



How to Start the Camera App

- ◆ Home page icon
- ◆ Lock Screen
- ◆ Control Center
- ◆ Spotlight Search
- ◆ Siri "Launch camera"



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Types of photos and Videos

- ◆ TIME-LAPSE
- ◆ SLO-MOTION
- ◆ CINEMATIC (iPhone 13 & 14)
- ◆ VIDEO
- ◆ PHOTO
- ◆ PORTRAIT (newer phones)
- ◆ SQUARE (in iPhone 11 and newer this moved to adjustment icons)
- ◆ PANO

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Taking a Photo


- ◆ Photo is the default mode
 - ◆ Setting > Camera > Preserve Settings
- ◆ Portrait or Landscape
- ◆ Timer 3 or 10 seconds
- ◆ 2 or 3 lens iPhones have optical zoom (2 or 3x)
 - ◆ Digital zoom up to 10X

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
Taking a Photo

- Auto Focus is on automatically and will often do a good job.
- Tap on screen where you want it to focus and expose
 - Adjust exposure by moving your finger up or down on the screen
- AF/AE (Auto Focus/Auto Exposure) tap & hold

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


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Flash for newer phones


- ◆ Tap flash icon on top left to turn flash on and off
- ◆ Tap arrow icon in top center to explore and hide adjustment icons
- ◆ Select flash icon and select
 - ◆ Auto
 - ◆ On
 - ◆ Flash Off

HDR (High Dynamic Range)

- ◆ The problem can be.....
 - ◆ Too bright and too dark at the same time
- ◆ HDR photos created by taking 3 photos
 - ◆ Underexposed, Correctly exposed, Over exposed
- ◆ These photos are combined to give “a better one”

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Smart HDR

- ◆ More advanced version on the iPhone 11
 - ◆ Takes burst of 4 photos and after each one
 - ◆ Takes a photo with various exposures
- ◆ Combines all 8 photos to create the Smart HDR image

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
