## Demo Prompts We Used

Writing Help: Write a polite email declining a dinner invitation because I already have plans. Use a warm tone. Limit to 100 words.

Organization: Create a packing checklist for a 10-day cruise. Organize into short categories. Limit to 100 words.

Simplifying Complexity: Explain Traditional vs Roth IRAs to a 70-year-old retiree using simple language and one analogy. Limit to 100 words.

## More Practice Prompts

Light Humor: Write a short, funny story about a 72-year-old learning new technology. Use a respectful tone and positive ending. Limit to 100 words.

Balanced Explanation: Explain why electric vehicles are becoming more popular. Assume I am skeptical. Include one benefit and one concern. Limit to 100 words.

Image Creation: Create a description for a peaceful beach at sunset in watercolor style with two older friends walking along the shore. Make it calm and uplifting. Limit to 100 words.
