Vice President Programs Renee Cabrera

Music is Renee Cabrera's first passion. She left college to join the United States Air Force Band in 1974. After leaving the Air Force she was employed by the University of California, Irvine for 28 years at UCI Medical Center in Orange,

where she had administrative, financial and audit responsibilities. Renee joined OLLI in 2015. She sings in the Voce D'Oro Chorale, plays the French horn in the Curtain Call Band and plays a mean trumpet in the OLLI Jazz Band.

In 2021, after serving as Trustee at Large on the OLLI Board of Trustees, Renee was elected Vice President Programs. Her principal responsibility is generating and delivering OLLI's curriculum of courses, events and activities—or programs. This includes oversight of the Curriculum Committee, chaired by Judy Alter, the Musical Performance

Committee, chaired by Renee and Rayleen Williams, the Technology Education Committee (TEC), chaired by Tom La Casa and Michael Shellman; the Transitions in Retirement (TiR) Committee, chaired by Russ MacKeand; and the Trips Committee, chaired by Ken Luke. All of these committees contribute new programs to be offered to OLLI members.

OLLI members who wish to start a new program must first apply for approval from the Curriculum Committee (see the instructions in the Blue Book under Committee Meetings).

The VP Programs's most time-consuming responsibility is probably as the Blue Book Development Lead. The development of each Blue Book starts with a month-long process by Renee's dedicated Section Editors: Sue Batie, Vickie Fears, Joanne Hardy, Patty McCollom, Ellie Monroe, Beverly Risse, Ann Sparks and Carol Thurk; Technical Assistants: Jim Monroe and Bill Reilly; and Scheduling Team: Ellie Monroe and Carol Thurk. They work directly with instructors and coordinators to update write-ups and scheduling for each program. Renee then turns the curriculum over to the Blue Book Editor, Chris Shaw, for copyediting by his team and printing by the University. This activity is performed three times per year and takes hundreds of work hours to accomplish.

Classroom space is the Scheduling Team's number one constraint, finding which days and times the instructor is available and locating the appropriate-sized classroom without intruding on the needs of the already established "legacy" courses. OLLI shares some classrooms in the Ruby Gerontology Center with CSUF, including Mackey Auditorium. Some OLLI courses must be scheduled in venues outside the RGC, like meeting rooms in the student housing area, the Kinesiology Building and Langsford Hall.

The VP Programs works with instructors to resolve issues that impact their courses. Renee may need to find a solution for problems like attendance growth beyond the capacity of the assigned classroom or meeting time conflicts with other programs and relocate the course to other facilities.

Finally, the VP Programs coordinates the training of instructors and coordinators. This year Renee will coordinate the Coordinators and Instructors Training Workshop on September 8 (see the Blue Book under OLLI Events), which is taught by Patsy Burns, OLLI's Administrative and Office Manager. Now that the pandemic has made Zoom and livestream routine venues for many of OLLI's courses, Renee helps to coordinate the training of instructors and coordinators by OLLI's tech team on how to host their class meetings on these computer platforms, and she assists with other training, as needed.

OLLI Masters in Gerontology Award Winner: Melina Wulin Ulloa

Graduate Award was presented to recipient Melina Wulin Ulloa by OLLI-CSUF Collaboration Chair Susan Mullaly and Robert Kovacev, newly elected OLLI Vice President External Relations at the Honors and Awards Ceremony at Titan Center on May 13. The award is supported by a check from OLLI for \$1,000.

A Mexican immigrant, born in Puerta Vallarta, Melina arrived in the U.S. at the age of 30 with determination to realize the American Dream, a dream to earn a college degree. In order to do this, she learned that she needed to start with a general education diploma (GED), which she earned within few months. That was followed by taking ESL classes (English as a second language) to polish up her speaking, reading and writing skills. She received an A.A. degree with honors in psychology from Fullerton Community College, then transferred to CSUF where she earned her Bachelor of Psychology with a Magna Cum Laude for her honor thesis.

Melania has worked to pay her tuition as a grad student assistant for the Graduate Studies office, where she provided resources for underrepresented master's students. She decided to stay at CSUF for her master's degree because she felt safe and supported by the Cal State Fullerton University community which, she said, "allowed me to be at ease while learning." In her last year

she completed several internships concentrating on older adults. Melina graduated in May with a 4.0 GPA.

Not content with her studies she also became president of two student organizations, joined professional resource groups and became the student representative for the California Council in Gerontology and Geriatrics and the Alumni Association. She became involved in groups outside of CSUF through Toastmasters International (T.I.), where she became a director of programs. She will continue her work with T.I. to "continue my personal development as a speaker and community leader." She has been a research assistant at the Fibromyalgia Lab and was named the new Lab manager for the next data intake wave. Somehow, she found time to author and present her research findings at professional conferences.

When asked how she has managed to take on so many academic and external activities, Melina laughed. She keeps a time management Outlook Planner to track study time, time to walk from the parking lot or bus stop to her classes, time for meetings etc. She credits her very supportive husband, Luis Salcedo, for often getting her to where she needs to be. She is grateful for the OLLI financial support and will purchase a new computer to ease her workload as she continues toward her goals as gerontologist, researcher and professor.

Following are highlights from OLLI's Board of Trustees meetings on May 12 and June 9:

- The newly elected members of the Board were officially installed.
- Certificates of Appreciation were presented to the outgoing Board members.
- Special thanks certificates were presented to Phillip Barnhard, Parliamentarian; Ellie Monore, President and Jim Monroe, super volunteer.
- Beginning in June, Board meetings returned to in-person on campus.
- Board meetings during the summer session will start at 10 a.m. but will switch to 8:30 a.m. during the fall semester. Meetings will continue every second Thursday of the month.
- A cash flow shortfall was offset by a portion of earnings from the Osher endowment.
- Appointments to the Board of Trustees: Phil Barnhard—Parliamentarian; Shirley Smith—VP Membership; Mike Stover—Trustee at Large and Lois Monroe—Trustee at Large.
- Fall operational planning was begun and program scheduling for the fall semester was near completion.
- Some of the Shapiro Wing's audiovisual equipment was repaired and some will be upgraded. OLLI is working with CSUF to decide what new equipment will be installed in Mackey Auditorium. There will be training on some new equipment.
- 20 new members enrolled for the summer session, bringing the total membership to 1,050.
- The vice presidents updated the following appointed positions: Blue Book—Chris Shaw, Editor; ChroniCLE—Chris Shaw, Editor; Digital Image Archive—Chris Shaw & Melinda Wiltsie, Leads; Newsletters—Ginger Barnhart, Lead; OLLI-CSUF Website—Dan Coby, Lead; Shapiro Electronic Bulletin Board—Melinda Wiltsie, Lead; Digital Document Archive—Joanne Hardy, Lead; Technology Education Committee—Tom La Casa & Michael Shellman, Co-Leads; OLLI Personnel and Support Committee—Harriette Millman, Chair; Mailing Committee—Harriette Millman, Chair; Development/Philanthropy Committee—Mike Stover, Chair; and Musical Performance

Committee—Renee Cabrera & Rayleen Williams, Co-Chairs.

- New Shapiro flooring is expected to be completed before the fall semester.
- Budget for promotion of the Fall Open House, including newspaper advertising and the creation, printing and distribution of a new membership recruiting brochure was approved. The new brochure will cost less than distributing Blue Books to the community, and it will target prospective members more effectively.
- Replacement of old computers and acquisition of peripherals and accessories was approved for the computer lab.
 - EIP change: Jack Hobson is leaving CSUF.
- The Collaboration Steering Committee meeting was planned for June 13 to discuss last year's accomplishments and plans for next year with CSUF associate deans.
- Coming Events: 1) The June Hospitality event was postponed until October 22. The theme will be OLLI State Fair; 2) OLLI Coffee Hour—June 20; 3) Summer Stroll Through the Arboretum—June 21; 3) Free Hearing Scanning—June 24; Fourth of July Celebration and Veterans Recognition—June 30.

The Board of Trustees meets the second Thursday of each month at 10:00 a.m. (during summer) in Shapiro CD and Zoom. All OLLI members are welcome to attend these meetings as guests.
