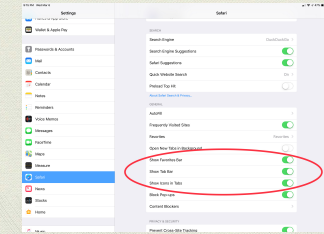

Basic Layout

- ◆ iPad has much more space to show things
- ◆ Favorites, tabs and navigation is on the top of the screen

◆ Settings → Safari

Basic Layout

- ◆ iPhone has a much smaller screen so many things are on the bottom of the screen or on another screen
 - ◆ i.e. tabs are pages that show on another screen

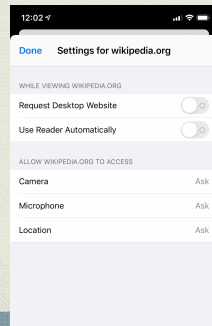
Starting with iPad OS 13

- ◆ By default iPad OS 13 & 14 tell the website you are using MacOS
 - ◆ This means you get the desktop version of the site, not the mobile version
- ◆ On iOS 12 or earlier the website might give you the mobile version.
 - ◆ Tap on the **⌘A** icon to have the option to **request** the Desktop or Mobile Version

Settings by website

- ◆ New in iOS 13
- ◆ Tap **AA** icon & select Website settings

- ◆ Faster speed
- ◆ Webpage Translations
- ◆ Watch videos while surfing the web
- ◆ Privacy Report
- ◆ Password in a Data Breach

iOS and iPad OS 14

- ◆ Log in to Websites using Face ID & Touch ID
- ◆ Image Picker redesign
- ◆ Home Screen Search Tool
- ◆ Switch Browser to Chrome, Firefox & others
- ◆ Give Web Apps your General Location

Address/Search Bar

- ◆ They are combined!
- ◆ As an Address bar
 - ◆ go directly to websites
- ◆ As a search bar
 - ◆ uses search engine (Google, Yahoo, Bing or DuckDuckGo)
 - ◆ Set in Setting > Safari
- ◆ Is the address highlighted in blue?
 - ◆ Accept it with return or type to replace it

Address/Search Bar

- ◆ **Quick website search**
 - ◆ Example
 - ◆ wiki nougat
- ◆ **See the full address**
 - ◆ Touch and hold the URL

Moving around

- ◆ Scroll down
- ◆ **Return to top of page**
 - ◆ **Tap top of screen twice**
- ◆ Double tap to make column fit screen
 - ◆ Double tap to return to regular page

Background vs Tabs/Pages

- ◆ Background web pages
 - ◆ sequential history where you can go back and forth
 - ◆ < or >
- ◆ Tabs (or Pages) open a new tab where you can still have background web pages

Tabs on iPad

- ◆ Create a new Tab
 - ◆ +
 - ◆ Or long press a link to open menu of options including Open in New Tab
- ◆ Navigating tabs
 - ◆ Tap  icon and select tab
- ◆ Deleting Tabs
 - ◆ Tap and Hold  icon and select choice of options



Pages on iPhone

- ◆ Add a Page
 - ◆ Pages icon 
 - ◆ +
 - ◆ Or long press a link and choose **Open in a New Tab**
- ◆ Navigating and deleting Pages
 - ◆ **Delete all tabs or Pages.** Tap and hold tab or pages icon

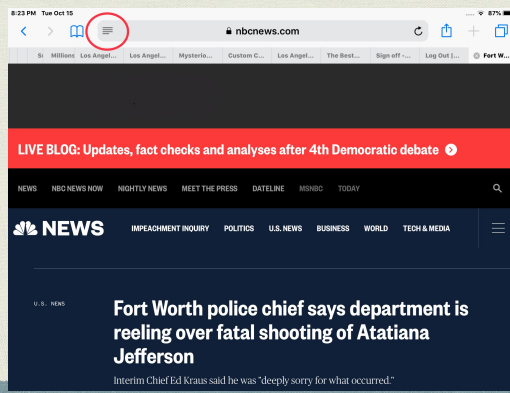

Reader Mode

- ◆ Shows only the good stuff in an article
 - ◆ On iOS 13 & 14 tap the Aa icon and tap Show Reader View
 - ◆ On older iOS, look for the 3 ½ lines at the left of the address bar
 - ◆ tap it to turn on reader.
 - ◆ tap it to turn off reader
- ◆ Persistent Reader View
 - ◆ Tap  and select this website
 - ◆ For all websites **Settings > Safari > Reader** and turn on Other Websites

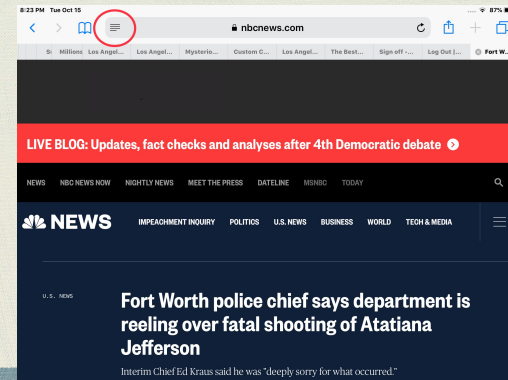

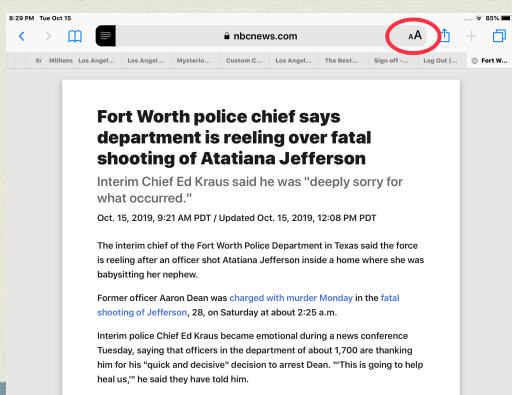

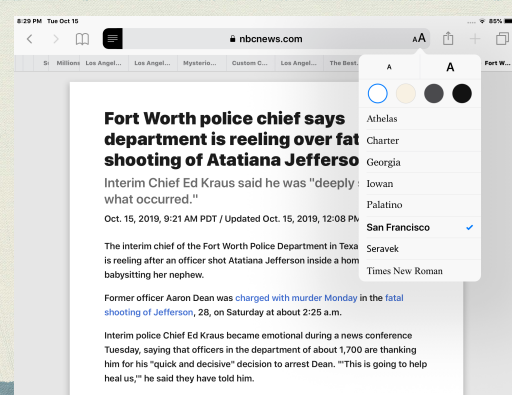

Bookmarks

- ◆ Create them with Share icon
 - ◆ "Regular"
 - ◆ Favorites
 - ◆ Arrange and delete them (2 ways)
- ◆ Go to them with Bookmark icon
 - ◆ press on it to make bookmarks appear and again to make it disappear
 - ◆ bookmark column is on the left

Reading List

- ◆ Alternative to Bookmarking
- ◆ Saves web page for off line reading
 - ◆ Go to Settings → Safari
 - ◆ (Reading List) Automatically Save Offline
- ◆ Save with Share icon/ Add to Reading List
- ◆ View from Bookmarks, Reading list is the middle column (Harry Potter glasses)
- ◆ Unread or All view

History

- ◆ Click on the clock icon on the right
 - ◆ This keeps a long history of your web page activity and searches
 - ◆ **Clear** deletes history, searches and cookies

Safari Settings

- ◆ Passwords
 - ◆ **Settings → Passwords**
- ◆ **Settings → Safari**
 - ◆ **Search Engine choice**
 - ◆ Google, Bing, Yahoo & DuckDuckGo

Safari Settings

- ◆ **Settings → Safari**
 - ◆ Block Cookies
 - ◆ Clear History and Website Data (cookies)
 - ◆ look under **Advanced > Website Data** to see what sites have saved a cookie
 - ◆ Autofill

Privacy

- ◆ Privacy Mode
 - ◆ **Recommended when using someone else's device**
- ◆ Pages / Tab
- ◆ Private / Done
 - ◆ shows bars at the top in gray
 - ◆ Will not save to regular history
 - ◆ Will not let web sites keep cookies on your device
 - ◆ Will keep last used private pages unless you close them
 - ◆ **Remember to delete them on someone else's device**

iCloud tabs

- ◆ Macs, iPhone and iPads
- ◆ In Settings/iCloud Safari must be turned on, on all devices
- ◆ If the tab is left in Safari on one device the tab is available to the other devices

Form Auto-fill

- ◆ **Settings → Safari → AutoFill**
- ◆ Optionally keeps
 - ◆ your contact info
 - ◆ credit cards

Keychain

- ◆ Keeps passwords for web sites (and since iOS 11, apps)
- ◆ **Settings → iCloud → Keychain** and turn it on

Passwords

- ◆ **Settings → Passwords → Accounts**
- ◆ Your Passcode is needed to see the passwords
- ◆ Can be used to “remember” forgotten passwords
- ◆ (Here is another reason not to share your device’s passcode)

◆ **Find on Page**

- ◆ In Share icon selections, choose Find on Page

◆ **Save a webpage to a home screen**

- ◆ In Share icon selections, choose Add to Home Page

◆ **Search** in the webpage

- ◆ Tap share icon
- ◆ Scroll down to find in page
- ◆ Type in a word or phrase in the text entry box at the bottom of the screen

◆ **Save webpage as a PDF** (here are 2 ways

- ◆ Tap Share icon
 - ◆ Tap Create PDF and share that to the app you want to keep the PDF
- ◆ Tap Share icon
 - ◆ Tap Print icon
 - ◆ Pinch out. This creates the PDF, then share that with the app you want to keep the PDF
 - ◆ With iOS 13 & 14 you can save the whole page not just what is on the screen
