For those seeking to view and discuss new foreign, independent and documentary films with an instructor having an expansive background in that arena, “Art House Cinema” might be a class of interest!

If you attended the Open House and walked through the Ruby Gerontology Center courtyard, you likely encountered an enthusiastic crowd cheering on Line Dancing students! You also encountered OLLI members sitting around tables, enjoying chats with future members as well as current classmates. The courtyard provides opportunities to sit down with friends for lively discussions or to “just relax” between classes. You also likely heard OLLI’s Crescendo Chorale and its three dozen members singing “The Sound of Music” or “The Music Man Medley.” The audience, completely filling the courtyard, expressed enthusiasm for the talents of the choir, headed by Tom Hut and Marge Osborn.

acquire clothing appropriate for the workplace. We are choosing Tuffy’s Career Closet because our members have been generous with the gently used business clothing donations over the past year. We feel they understand the need to ensure that scholars of all sizes and specific needs would benefit from this campaign. Our second goal for this fundraising will be very personal to OLLI. OLLI member, Betty Redmon, has written an original musical, and we would love to help her produce this work in January. The reading of this musical will take place in Mackey Auditorium, and is casted with OLLI members. We find that we need to upgrade some of our audio equipment to ensure that Betty and our members are allowed to present a product with the best results. This equipment would also be helpful to OLLI in our livestreamed classes in the future. We have set a goal of \$3,000 for each project.

Our Listen Up project from our crowdfunding campaign last year is still moving forward. While it has been a painfully slow process, it is still alive, and we hope to have our equipment early this fall. Some other ways our donations have been put to use this year were an increase of copyrighted music for the Crescendo Chorale’s 70 members, a new 360-degree camera that is used by the Board and other committees for Zoom meetings, and a refresh to our Shapiro lobby.

As the Vice President Communications, Jim oversees a large assortment of electronic and print media that communicate information to OLLI members.

The Blue Book Course Catalog, OLLI’s oldest publication going back to 1979, is produced each semester describing the courses, activities and events offered and their schedules.

The ChroniCLE also goes back to OLLI’s roots. This newsletter is published like a newspaper and distributed to all members monthly (except July and December). It reports on what is going on at OLLI, giving profiles and photos of OLLI members and the activities that happen throughout the year and information about administrative issues at OLLI.

Three weekly newsletters are emailed to members: the Class Information & Updates Newsletter, Announcement

& Events Newsletter and Open to the Public Newsletter. They provide weekly curriculum updates and timely event and administrative announcements to members, plus important stand-alone emails with time-sensitive information, like class cancellations.

An electronic bulletin board in the lobby of the Shapiro Wing lists the current schedule of classes for each day, plus rotating slides which provide topical information about administrative issues and upcoming events.

The OLLI website at <https://olli.fullerton.edu/> holds a vast array of information about OLLI for members and the public, including the full schedule and descriptions of classes, activities and events for the entire semester.

The Digital Image Archive is OLLI’s repository of all photos and videos taken of OLLI members, events and activities. Jim Di Tota is also OLLI’s Photography Coordinator and maintains a cadre of volunteer photographers who immortalize OLLI’s events and take portraits of OLLI members, which may be used in OLLI’s Blue Book, ChroniCLE and various other publications and presentations.

Finally, our newest and most exciting communication medium is OLLI’s social media presence. OLLI has a Facebook page at <https://www.facebook.com/OLLICalStateFullerton> and an Instagram page at <https://www.instagram.com/ollicsuf>. OLLI also has a LinkedIn account and another Instagram page aimed at CSUF students and professors. Social media provides another fun way for members to keep up with what’s going on at OLLI, in addition to promoting OLLI to the public.

Jim has a talented and committed team of volunteers on the Communications Team (listed on the OLLI website under About OLLI/Organizational Structure), who produce all these popular media outlets that are well-respected for their quality and value.

The OLLI Hospitality Committee begins preparing for Fall Open House several weeks before the event; the Vice President Hospitality, Lisa Sewell, and the Committee plan an appealing light lunch for the guests and the OLLI member hosts.

The Committee decided to serve a nostalgic Grab

and Go brown bag lunch with turkey, ham and veggie sandwiches from Sprout's, bags of chips and cookies, napkins and condiments. A fun idea was to decorate each brown bag with a greeting or an attribute of OLLI membership. Several Committee members took home the bags a few weeks before the event and added creative drawings, stickers and even sparkling gems, giving them a really special touch.

Lisa Sewell was the "Lead" and major shopper for the event, this included comparing prices and quality to find the best products to serve appetizing lunches.

She delivered the non-perishable foods on Friday afternoon. Dennis Wilson's special poker group had volunteered to stay after class to help Facilities Vice President, Anthony Gonzalez, set up the tables, chairs and canopies in and around RGC, including the serving and dining areas in the Shapiro Wing. Lisa had drawn a room plan for him.

Timothy Holmes, Pete Saputo and Elaine Mitchell were assigned to set up and maintain the three water stations outside. Kent Morris volunteered to help monitor and refill as needed. The stations were ready before the scheduled time for the OLLI members who were working very hard to wow our guests — it was a warm day. In the meantime, Tina Ernsting, the leader of the "Bag Ladies," manned the Grab and Go bag assembly and filling lines. She made sure the correct number of the colorful bags were marked on the reverse with a "T," "H," or "V" for the turkey, ham or veggie sandwiches. Her crews began placing the open bags in easy-access rows, opening the large boxes of chips and cookies to distribute in each area, along with the individual condiment packs and napkins.

Steve Sewell picked up from Sprout's Market the freshly made, individually wrapped ham, turkey and veggie sandwiches and delivered them to the OLLI kitchen. Bonnie Harrington, Celia Reynolds, Annette Lauritzen, Cristina Corrales and Janet Preciado packed the bags at the turkey station. Vicky Bushman, Nancy Parker and Marilyn Bean manned the ham station. The veggie station was crewed by Nancy Carlton, Jeanne Lichman, Susan Berry and Ofie Igasaki. At 11:00 a.m. each crew

went on to pass out their filled bags to our guests.

Promptly at 11:00 a.m., the posted lunch service time, Lisa and her big welcoming smile opened the doors to Shapiro and greeted the guests, both members and non-members. The smiling Grab and Go lunch station crew and runners distributed 374 bags in less than 40 minutes!

Many people ate their lunches at the tables provided in the Shapiro Wing; others went outside to the courtyard tables and chairs. By noon, all of the Committee members were gathering equipment used inside and out, returning unused supplies to their storage areas, gathering trash, washing, drying and putting away all the dispensers, coffee pots and any cutlery, bowls and utensils. They were wiping down all the tables (Anthony's facilities crew members were folding and storing tables and returning chairs to the carts); gathering the centerpieces, draining the vases and packing them for Lisa to take home. They gathered all the tablecloths, dish towels and aprons; Committee members volunteer to take home as many as they can handle to launder and return quickly. Table clothes, especially, may be needed within a day or two. Wiping down the kitchen sinks and counters and sweeping the floor were the final touches before all the very busy bees could go to their hives and put their feet up!

One Committee member, Marie Stiegler, wrapped up the event using copies of all the necessary receipts, reimbursement requests, donations and leftovers to enter in a spreadsheet to account for all expenses and purchases. Good recordkeeping helps in planning future events.

The Hospitality Committee facilitates and promotes social interactions for OLLI members outside the class rooms. Their yearly calendar will usually include four fun-filled events, one per season, each with an individual, varied and often creative theme. The events can be held on campus, or off, and usually include lunch or dinner. The Committee is also charged with supporting OLLI business meetings with refreshments; these meetings include the OLLI Board of Trustees election and their installation and retreat, the August Open House and the January Spring Preview.

The Hospitality Committee welcomes new members. There are no requirements because there are so many varied opportunities to participate. If you want to share good times and support OLLI, visit the Committee at their monthly meetings held on the first Friday of each month, 10:30 a.m. to noon, usually in Room 8. Check them out!

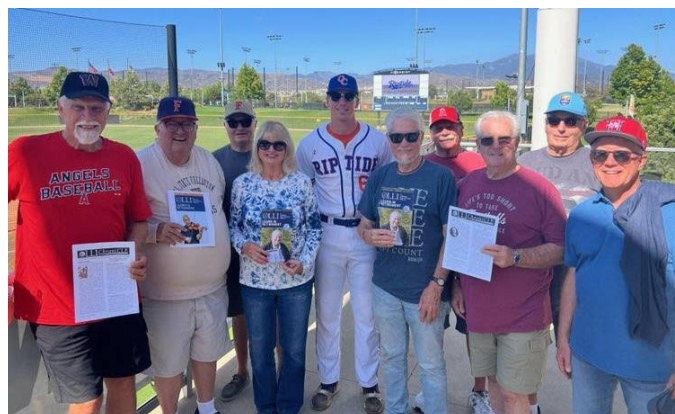
Sports Talk Goes on Field Trip

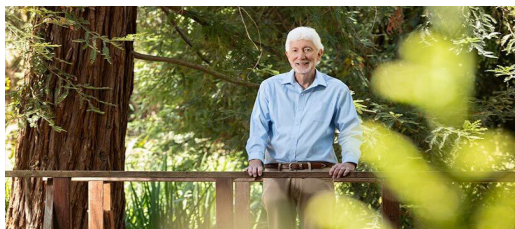

The following are highlights from OLLI's Board of Trustees meeting on August 14, 2025:

- With Dr. Walker's help, we are making progress with CSUF on reimbursing members for OLLI expenses.
- OLLI made the turnaround in the OLLI parking lot available for CSUF students to move into their housing on August 21 and 22.
- CSUF's new fire road to run behind Mackey Auditorium may result in losing some parking spaces in OLLI's lot.
- Part time office staff member, Nicole Zuniga, is leaving and a replacement is being recruited.
- Member Roberta Pantle wrote a complementary essay to President Vickie Hite and the Hospitality Committee about OLLI's 4th of July celebration (reprinted in this ChroniCLE).
- The Open House had 546 attendees, including 206 guests. The Registration Assistance Team and the OLLI office were swamped, helping new members to register and helping members renew their membership. Total sign-ups as of August 14 were over 600 – a good start. The various recruiting methods that were used are being studied to determine the most effective for future use.
- OLLI will do a crowdfunding drive in October to support the CSUF Student Basic Services (Basic Needs and Tuffy's Closet).
